Course Syllabus

Course Description: This course is a 36-week course entitled Bible Truths “Directions for Early Christians”. This course focuses on lessons from the New Testament, specifically Paul’s Prison Epistles and Pastoral Epistles, the General Epistles and the book of Revelation. Epistles within each group are discussed chronologically. Each lesson attempts to highlight the key teaching of the passage (e.g. a character quality the student should cultivate, an action he should take, or a truth he should believe). Scripture verse memory work will also be incorporated from the NKJV Bible as well as critical writing and projects. In addition, students will be required to keep and maintain a class notebook with all completed assignments and assessments.

Major Topics: Prison Epistles, Pastoral Epistles, General Epistles, New Testament Prophecy
