Course Syllabus

Course Description: This course is a 36-week course entitled Biblical Worldview “Creation, Fall, Redemption”. This course focuses on the Bible’s story of creation, fall, and redemption as an overview of the biblical worldview and guides application of this worldview to multiple social institutions and disciplines. In the process, it introduces students to apologetic methods and guides them to discern and refute false worldviews. Particular attention is given to teaching students to rebuild social institutions and disciplines from a biblical worldview. Scripture verse memory work will also be incorporated from the NKJV Bible as well as critical writing and projects. In addition, students will be required to keep and maintain a class notebook with all completed assignments and assessments.

Major Topics: Worldview, Creation, Fall, Redemption, Gender, Government, Science, History, Arts & Culture.
