2nd hour choices for 10th Honors and 11th Grade:

Photography I: To educate students in the art of photography. The students will cover the basics of still and moving photography/videography with a focus on nature. Students would have to be willing to have active participation in and out of the classroom on these projects. Meets Art requirement. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 18 students Duration: 1 Semester**

Teacher Assistant I: This course is designed to develop competencies related to the career path of teacher assistants. Students will assist elementary classroom teachers with their roles and responsibilities. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 12 students Duration: 1 Semester**

Teacher Assistant II: Prerequisite – Teaching Assistant I. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 12 students Duration: 1 Semester**

***Vocal Ensemble I
(Praise Team/band)** This course allows for experiences in worship leading while learning the basics of music arranging and song writing. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition required. Meets Art requirement.

Max: 12 students

Duration: 2 Semesters

***Vocal Ensemble II
(Praise Team/band)** Prerequisite – Vocal Ensemble I. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition required. Meets Art requirement.

Max: 12 students

Duration: 2 Semesters

***Vocal Ensemble III
(Praise Team/band)** Prerequisite--Vocal Ensemble I and II. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition Required. Meets Art requirement. **Max: 12 students**

Duration: 2 Semesters

Math for College This course will familiarize students with the format of the SAT, teach testing techniques and strategies, and provide a comprehensive review. Students will also develop organizational skills necessary to master the SAT test. It is encouraged that Juniors take this course 1st semester or Sophomores take this course 2nd semester. **Max: 20 students**
Duration: 1 Semester

***Yearbook/
Journalism 1** Would you like to have an active role in learning how to create our TCA yearbook? You will play an important part of this process while learning about all facets of producing and publishing this TCA legacy. This class is full of opportunities to create our yearly masterpiece.
Requirements: Instructor approval Duration: 1 semester

**BUSI-1902
Personal Finance** A **Southeastern University (SEU) dual enrollment class** that will provide 3 college credits upon successful completion. This course covers personal financial stewardship from a Christian perspective. Topics include: cash flow management, use of credit, investing, etc. **This cost of this course is \$25 plus the price of the textbook.**
The amount will be billed to the student account and due by Sept. 1.
Requirements: SEU and TCA approval Duration: 1 semester

PHIL-2003

Principle of Ethics A **Southeastern University (SEU) dual enrollment class** that will Provide 3 college credits upon successful completion. This course is An examination of moral and social conduct and decision making in light of biblical and theological teaching. Contemporary ethical issues addressed (abortion, euthanasia, human rights, etc.).
The cost of this course is \$25 plus the price of the textbook. The Amount will be billed to the student account and due by Sept. 1.
Requirements: SEU and TCA approval Duration: 1 semester

8th hour choices for 10th Advanced/11th Grade:

***Yearbook:** Have an active part in creating our TCA yearbook. Learn about all facets of producing and publishing a school yearbook. Be a part in making our yearbook a great success. Meets Art requirement. **Requirements: Instructor interview and approval. Duration: 1 Semester**

Intro to Engineering: This is a project oriented introductory course to engineering design.
Students dig deep into the engineering design process, applying math, science, and engineering standards to hands-on projects. They work both individually and in teams to design projects each quarter and to document their work. Students can expect to spend approximately \$40 in supplies and materials. This class can only be taken once and meets .5 credit of art requirement.
Max: 20 students. Duration: 1 Semester

Contemporary History: This course focuses on the history, politics, major events and pop culture of the 1950s to the present day. This class can only be taken once.
Max: 18 students Duration: 1 Semester

Art of Design This class is for students who have a desire and passion to work with two-dimensional drawings while learning important design techniques. Students will learn about the design process and fundamental principles of design in order to Enhance their abilities and develop a perspective that helps them offer valuable critique about art and design. This class will feature weekly sketchbook drawings and projects which focus on enhancing creativity and problem-solving skills. Students will grow in their ability to take ordinary problems and create extraordinary solutions. *Students will need to purchase "Design Basics" by Stephen Pentak--\$9.99, sketchbook--\$5, and drawing pencils--\$5.*
Maximum students: 18 Duration: 1 Semester

Education Training and Childhood Development This course is designed to develop skills related to the career path of an individual who is interested in working with elementary-aged children. Students will assist school staff with various responsibilities as well as help

the after-care program. Students will be required to engage with children in a responsible and nurturing manner.

Maximum students: 8 students

Duration: 1 Semester

Team Sports

This course will enable students to develop basic-level knowledge and skills in a variety of team sports appropriate to your level of capability, as well as to maintain or improve health-related fitness.
