2nd hour Elective Choices:

Ecology: The Florida Ecology class covers all of the major topics in Ecology, the study of interactions between the living organisms and non-living factors of an environment. The class will focus a unit of study on the Florida Everglades and the mangrove swamps of Florida. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 20 Students** **Duration: 1 Semester**

Teacher Assistant I: This course is designed to develop competencies related to the career path of teacher assistants. Students will assist elementary classroom teachers with their roles and responsibilities. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 12 students** **Duration: 1 Semester**

Teacher Assistant II: Prerequisite – Teaching Assistant I. This class can only be taken once. **Max: 12 students** **Duration: 1 Semester**

***Vocal Ensemble I
(Praise Team/band)** This course allows for experiences in worship leading while learning the basics of music arranging and song writing. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition required. Meets Art requirement. **Max: 12 students** **Duration: 2 Semesters**

***Vocal Ensemble II
(Praise Team/band)** Prerequisite – Vocal Ensemble I. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition required. Meets Art requirement. **Max: 12 students** **Duration: 2 Semesters**

***Vocal Ensemble III
(Praise Team/band)** Prerequisite--Vocal Ensemble I and II. Requirements: Students are chosen based on musical aptitude and leadership qualities. Audition Required. Meets Art requirement. **Max: 12 students** **Duration: 2 Semesters**

**BUSI-1003
Foundations of
Business**

A **Southeastern University (SEU) dual enrollment class** that will provide 3 college credits upon successful completion. This course focuses on the foundations of business in a mixed economy. This includes a major overview of areas of study in the business curriculum including economics, finance, management, and marketing.

The cost of this course is \$25 plus the price of the textbook. The amount will be billed to the student account and due by Feb. 1

Requirements: SEU and TCA approval Duration: 1 Semester

SEU CLAS-1003

A **Southeastern University (SEU) dual enrollment class** that will help students develop and improve academic skills (note-taking, test-taking, etc.). Students will discover their individual learning styles and determine how to adjust their methods of learning. Other variables such as health, finances, relationships, and attitude that also play a role in the life of a college student are also explored.

The cost of this course is \$25 plus the price of the textbook. The amount will be billed to the student account and due by Feb. 1

Requirements: SEU and TCA approval Duration: 1 Semester

Epic Poetry

The goal of this course is to introduce, explore, and examine the major Epic poems of the western canon with particular emphasis upon answering the question, "What does it mean to be human?", and then juxtapose our findings with how the Biblical text answers the same question. Consequently, we will then be better equipped to develop a mature understanding of our historico-cultural context in relation to Identity formation. Students will need to purchase: The Iliad, Odyssey, Inferno and Paradise Lost (can be ordered on Amazon for under \$10 each. **Max: 15 students Duration: 1 Semester**

Sports Management

This course is an introduction of today's sport industry and will market career interests. Students will be exposed to theoretical foundations and practical applications for critical elements of the sports management industry. This class can only be taken once.

Max: 18 students.

Duration: 1 Semester

8th hour Elective Choices:

***Yearbook:**

Sports Management

**Contemporary
History:**

This course focuses on the history, politics, major events and pop culture of the 1950s to the present day. This class can only be taken once.

Max: 18 students

Duration: 1 Semester

Intro to Engineering:

This is a project oriented introductory course to engineering design.

Students dig deep into the engineering design process, applying math, science, and engineering standards to hands-on projects. They work both individually and in teams to design projects each quarter and to document their work. Students can expect to spend approximately \$40 in supplies and materials. This class can only be taken once and meets .5 credit of art requirement.

Max: 18 students.

Duration: 1 Semester

Criminology

This course will provide students with insight into the field of Criminal Justice. During the semester we will cover the three basic principles in Criminal Justice, Policing, Courts, and Corrections. We will also discuss special topics such as victim-ology, crime scene investigation, criminal profiling, fingerprinting, forensic science and most of all, where does Jesus fit in this content area?

Max: 20 students

Duration: 1 Semester

**Education Training
and Childhood
Development**

This course is designed to develop skills related to the career path of an individual who is interested in working with elementary-aged children. Students will assist school staff with various responsibilities as well as help the after-care program. Students will be required to engage with children in a responsible and nurturing manner.

Maximum students: 10 students

Duration: 1 Semester

**Weightlifting and
Fitness**

The purpose of weightlifting class is to provide each student with knowledge of the importance of strength and fitness training. Students will understand the value of setting goals for personal improvement and will leave the class with a lifelong understanding of how to maintain adequate physical fitness for a healthy lifestyle. This class is open to and will include evaluation based on completed exercise workouts and achieved goals.

Maximum students: 10

Duration: 1 Semester
