Course Syllabus

Course Description: This course is a 36-week course entitled Bible Truths “Lessons from the Early Church”. This course begins with the book of Acts and continues chronologically through Paul’s earliest epistles: the letters to the Galatians, Thessalonians, Corinthians, and Romans. Acts comes first because a knowledge of the New Testament’s historical background is necessary for understanding the epistles that follow. Paul’s early epistles are doctrinal in nature. This is no coincidence since Paul desired to establish his new converts in their faith. For this reason these epistles are important for young people because they need to understand what they believe. Each section highlights the key teachings of the passage covered along with the practical applications that flow from the doctrine. Scripture verse memory work will also be incorporated from the NKJV Bible as well as critical writing and projects. In addition, students will be required to keep and maintain a class notebook/ binder with all completed assignments and assessments.

Major Topics: Birth of the Church, Church growth, expansion of the Church, salvation by the work of Christ, preparing for the return of Christ, living out the love of Christ.
